Official USDA Documents

The meeting adjourned at 2:20 p.m.

The individuals listed above were present to witness the official signing of the USDA Loan documents by Vice Chair Dr. Paul Baltz for the Health Science Complex. This action obligates USDA to set aside this loan amount. The rate is locked in at 3.5% for 28 years with annual payments of approximately \$560,000 for a loan amount up to \$9.5 million. IBERIABANK will provide the interim financing for the upcoming project. BRTC is required to open an appropriate construction account and deposit \$2.5 million which will be spent before drafting funds from IBERIABANK. Justin Ladd mentioned that Aaron Ruby, of Ruby Architects, has worked closely with his office on the project. He also believes the firm is on target with the schematics and many details of the project.
