I understand that if required to enroll in developmental education courses as a result of my test scores and Arkansas law, Act 1101, an additional semester may be required to complete my program of study. The Firefighter Essentials program is designed to provide students with the knowledge of modern municipal and rural fire protection and the skills to apply that knowledge effectively. Students are introduced to various aspects of the fire service through classroom and laboratory exercises. Students will experience a fast-paced, high stress level of training that mimics modern fire service duties and requirements.

This program is a career-ladder where Firefighter Essentials program graduates receive a technical certificate which prepares them to seek employment in the fire-service field as well as advance their education into the Associates of Applied Science in Fire Science.

Graduates should be prepared to enter the fire service as an entry level firefighter and to have met the qualifications of NFPA 1023 and 2013, Arkansas State Minimum Firefighter Standards (IFSAC Firefighter 1 and 2.)
