

BRTC Continues to Maintain the Highest Standards of Quality and Excellence

Black River Technical College (BRTC) continues to uphold its reputation as a distinguished institution of higher education, exemplified by its recent accreditation record. In April 2023, BRTC received full reaffirmation of accreditation from the Higher Learning Commission (HLC) with no stipulations or monitoring required—a notable achievement among institutions. This outcome highlights the college's commitment to maintaining the highest standards of quality and excellence.



Looking ahead, BRTC's next comprehensive evaluation will take place in the 2028-2029 academic year, with a Multilocation Visit scheduled for 2026-2027. The Multilocation Visit will assess the college's additional locations, which currently total 23, including 16 area high schools. Notable expansions during the 2023-2024 academic year included the addition of JCA Powersports, the GIN, and Hillcrest High School, with Riverside High School formally added in November 2024.

BRTC's exceptional accreditation status, free from the need for monitoring or sanctions, speaks volumes about the institution's dedication to providing high-quality education and upholding its mission to serve students and the community effectively.

Higher Learning Commission Formally Approves LPN-to-RN Transitional Pathway

The Licensed Practical Nurse-to-Registered Nurse Transitional pathway is a twelve-month program that offers Licensed Practical Nurses and Licensed Vocational Nurses the chance to complete their Registered Nursing degree without retaking Practical Nursing courses. The program enables working Licensed Practical Nurses and Licensed Vocational Nurses to complete their coursework on Tuesday and Thursday evenings. Clinical requirements occur on weekends and occasional weekdays.
